# 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2024

### XXIX SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Mark 10:35-45

The passage begins with James and John approaching Jesus with a strikingly bold request: "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you" (Mk 10:35). This request, while fearless, reveals something deeply human—our desire for certainty, for favor, and for recognition. James and John were among Jesus' closest disciples, part of the inner circle that had witnessed His Transfiguration (Mark 9:2-13). They had seen glimpses of His glory, and now they wanted to secure their place in that glory.

While we may be tempted to judge James and John harshly for their apparent selfishness, their request mirrors our own human tendencies. How often do we approach God with the expectation that He will fulfill our desires, grant us favor, or give us a position of influence? Like James and John, we may not fully understand the implications of what we are asking for. Our prayers may reflect our own desires for comfort, success, or recognition, rather than a willingness to submit to God's will, no matter the cost.

Jesus told them that they would indeed drink the cup He drank and be baptized with His baptism, and this prophecy was fulfilled in their lives. James was the first of the twelve to give his life for the Gospel, and his martyrdom marked the beginning of the church's persecution under Herod.

John, on the other hand, lived a long life, but his path was no less marked by suffering. According to tradition, John was exiled to the island of Patmos, where he received the visions recorded in the book of Revelation. Though he was not martyred like his brother James, John endured persecution and hardship for the sake of the Gospel.

The lives of James and John offer us profound lessons about discipleship and what it means to live a life for God. First, their request for glory was fulfilled in a surprising way—James became the first apostle to die, and John the last, both living lives marked by suffering and devotion to Christ. Second, they learned to embrace Jesus' call to be "last" and "slave of all," living lives of humble service to others. Finally, they lived lives of sacrificial love, laying down their lives for the sake of others, just as Jesus gave His life as a ransom for many.
